Learning Agreement (LA) or Online Learning Agreement (OLA). <p>➤ These required documents are compulsory and must be sent by application deadline!</p> <p>Nominated student will get credentials and link to the system.</p> <p>Required documents must be added to SoleMOVE mobility system to the application (except OLA).</p>
Further information about the required documents	<p>*Please advise an applicant whether you require LA or OLA. Only one of them will be signed/confirmed.</p> <p>Learning Agreement (pdf) must be added to SoleMOVE mobility system together with other required documents.</p>
Language requirements	<p>English language skills: at least B2 level according to the CEFR. See also: European Levels - Self Assessment Grid.</p> <p>No proof is needed.</p>
Admission package	<p>Admission package will be sent via SoleMOVE mobility system:</p> <p>Autumn semester/academic year: by the end of May</p> <p>Spring semester: in the beginning of December</p>

Lecture period	<p>Usually from the beginning of the semester until the third week of December/end of May</p>
Exam period	<p>Usually from mid-December/May until the end of the semester</p>
Orientation course	<p>Orientation course takes place before the semester starts (in the end of August/in the beginning of February)</p> <p>More information in here: ut.ee/en/orientation-course</p>
Recommended arrival dates	<p>1-2 days before the orientation course starts.</p>
Course catalogue	<p>Link to the course catalogue: ut.ee/en/courses-taught-english-and-grading</p> <p>Course catalogue is updated by March 15 (autumn semester) and October 1 (spring semester) and again by the beginning of the semester.</p>

Course selection	Each student is free to select courses from different programmes and faculties (from the course catalogue). However, in the inter-institutional agreement's partners have mutually fixed ISCED field. So, an incoming student is required to take at least a few courses from the study field fixed in the particular agreement. Student can see their respective ISCED field in the SoleMOVE mobility system (Study information → EU subject area).
UT requirements	At least to the extent of 15 ECTS per semester (except for PhD and traineeship students). One credit point corresponds to 26 hours of studies (lectures, seminars, practice, homework or independent work, assessment of learning outcomes) performed by a student.
Course registration	Study Information System username/password will be sent by the beginning of the semester.
Grading system and credits	UT uses both a differentiated and a non-differentiated grading system to assess the academic progress of students. Further information: ut.ee/en/courses-taught-english-and-grading ECTS credits.
Transcript of Records	It is issued only by student's request and it is not sent automatically. It is a student's responsibility to contact dean's office at the end of the studies and inform them whether the document should be sent by email or by post.

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	<p>Accommodation at the student hostel is provided ONLY for the fixed period (as the period stated in the student's admission letter).</p> <p>Students who are nominated to one of UT's regional colleges in Narva or Pärnu will get information about accommodation procedure directly from the college coordinator.</p>

RESIDENCE ISSUES and HEALTH INSURANCE

EU citizens (including European Economic Area and Swiss Confederation)	EU citizens do not need to apply for visa. EU citizens are allowed to stay in Estonia on the basis of a valid travel document or identity card for the period of up to 3 months. As international students usually stay longer,
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	then they must register themselves as citizens of Tartu and apply for an ID-card. This can be done after arrival to Estonia. More information: tartuwelcomecentre.ee/registry-services/
Non-EU citizens	Along with the admission package, students will receive information on how to apply for the long-term (D) visa. More information: ut.ee/en/visainfo
Information about health insurance	EU students: European Health Insurance Card Further information in here . Non-EU students: For long-term (D) visa it is required to have international travel medical insurance which guarantees payment of any costs related to medical treatment due to illness or injury during the validity of the visa, in case of a multiple entry visa until the end of the first intended period of stay.
